

Special Guidelines for Perry County 4-H'ers

At any 4-H event, whether on the local, county, district, regional, state, or national level, we require that our 4-H'ers be obedient to all rules and authority. Any certified volunteer or Extension personnel who is at an event has the authority to send home or call a 4-H'er's parents for any type of disobedience or breaking of rules. One policy that we have implemented is a Public Display of Affection Rule – which means there is to be NO romantic affection to be shown between 4-H'ers. 4-Hers should at all times be setting a good example for others, especially younger 4-H'ers.

Inclement Weather Policy

In the event of snow, ice, or severe weather on the day of a 4-H event, listen to 101.7 KVOM in Morrilton for cancellations or changes.

This I Believe

- Ⓢ The 4-H boy and girl are more important than the 4-H project
- Ⓢ 4-H is not trying to replace the home, the church and the school, only to supplement them
- Ⓢ 4-H'ers are their own best exhibit
- Ⓢ No 4-H award is worth sacrificing the reputation of a 4-H member or leader
- Ⓢ Competition is a natural human trait and should be recognized as such in 4-H club work. It should be given no more emphasis than other fundamentals in 4-H
- Ⓢ Learning how to do the project is more important than the project itself
- Ⓢ A blue ribbon 4-H'er with a red ribbon pig is more desirable than a red ribbon 4-H'er with a blue ribbon pig
- Ⓢ Generally speaking, there is more than one good way of doing most things
- Ⓢ To "learn by doing" is fundamental in any sound educational program and is characteristic of the 4-H program
- Ⓢ Every 4-H member needs to be noticed, to be important, to achieve and to be praised
- Ⓢ Our job is to teach 4-H members HOW to think, NOT "what" to think!
