4-H A.O.S. Student Code of Conduct

While at the 4-H Center, students will follow the 4-H A.O.S. Code of Conduct.

All rules and regulations governing an activity will be discussed with students, teachers, leaders, agents, and chaperones at the beginning of the program.

All students are under the supervision of any adults assigned to the event.

Students participating in any of the following will, after review, be expelled from the 4-H Center and all activities.

- X Possession or use of illegal substances, drugs, alcoholic beverages, or tobacco.
- X Theft, misuse or abuse of public or personal property.
- X Sexual misconduct.
- X Possession of weapons or fireworks.
- X Assault or personal harm or threat of an assault or personal harm.
- X Unauthorized absence from the premises of the event.
