OBJECTIVES

Targeted Life Skills: Responsible citizenship, self-esteem, self-responsibility, character, cooperation, communication, wise use of resources, decision-making Opportunities will be provided for faculty to share information about related college degree programs in forestry, zoology, biology, fish and wildlife, natural sciences; and career options in wildlife biologist, natural resources specialist, forester and wildlife officer.

The purpose of this activity is to offer 4-H members the opportunity to learn safe Archery handling, proper care of equipment, and rules of Archery safety. The Archery shooting contest and a brief examination will offer 4-H members the opportunity to demonstrate their skill in target shooting and their knowledge of archery safety.

ELIGIBILITY

2019 State O-Rama Archery is a state only activity and will allow one participant from each county.

ACTIVITY

This activity will consist of three parts:

1. A general archery safety session where these topics will be discussed:
 - a. Archery safety rules
 - b. Safe handling
 - c. Shooting range procedure
2. A brief written examination – Material for the exam will come from National Archery in the School Program, Arkansas Game and Fish regulations, and 4-H Archery guidelines.
3. Target shooting – Each participant will be provided with a target and a scorecard which is to be signed by the shooter.

- a. The target used will be a Morrell PF5 or 5 Spot Target
- b. The shooting distance will be 10 meters.

The contest will consist of 2 rounds or ends of 5 arrows. Total of 10 shots with 1 arrow at each bullseye.

Equipment –

- Arrows must be NASP approved arrows.
- Bows Must be Standard Genesis Bows following NASP requirements. Competitors can bring their own bow or use one provided.
- Quiver Stands will be provided on the line.

JUDGING

Each participant will be scored on the combination of the examination score and the target score. Violation of shooting range instructions may, at the discretion of the judge, result in eviction from the range because of the level of safety that must be maintained at all times on the range. Total score possible is 100 (50 points examination and 50 points for shooting).

Scoring Rings points will be 2,3,4,5, and 5x on each bullseye.

In case of a tie for any of the top five places, the highest shooting score will be used to break the tie. If a tie still remains, then the wildest shots will be thrown out progressively until the tie is broken or, at the judge's option, one more end of 5 will be shot to break the tie.

AWARDS

At state, the first-place winner will receive a trophy. Ribbons will be awarded to second- through fifth-place winners. Participation ribbons will be awarded to all participants not placing at both the district and state events.
