Residual herbicides applied at planting are beginning to break and as of now we can't get a decent rain to activate new over-the-top applications so our cooperators are holding out for better rain chances. Cross	Armor 48D24	VC	.52" rain, Stand counts next week, lower areas of the field may need to be replanted will re-evaluate next week. Overall stand looks good still a few emerging.
Desha	Armor 48D24	V4	Emerged grass and few broadleaves, couldn't find any pigweeds. Recommended 1 qt. generic glyphosate + 12.8 oz. Outlook.

Lawrence	Asgrow 46X6	V3	.15" Rain, almost V4, quickly outgrowing chemical burn, good control of small pigweeds and grasses emerging. 5/25 applied 32oz Glyphosate + 2pts Prefix/acre.
Lee	Pioneer P47T36R	V1	Emerged 5-24 to stand of 120K plants/acre. Very clean from Boundary application. Want to keep it that way so recommended glyphosate + 2 oz. Zidua.
