Table 1 presents USDA Farm Service Agency's certified Arkansas cotton planted acreage by NASS district. In 2013, cotton was planted on 280,670 acres in the state. The leading two districts were District 3 and District 6, with 188,806 and 66,467 total acres planted, respectively. These two districts are located in the Delta region, and represent nearly 84% of planted acreage in 2013.




Figure 1 presents planted cotton acreage categories for Arkansas counties.




Figure 2 presents the top five counties for planted cotton acreage in Arkansas. Mississippi and Craighead counties led the state in cotton acreage planted, with 80,240 and 54,367 acres planted, respectively. The counties of Clay, Lee, and St. Francis complete the top five counties in acreage planted. These five counties represented approximately 68% of total cotton acreage planted in 2013.




Figure 3 presents irrigated cotton acreage percentages for Arkansas counties in 2013.
