Reporting Multi-State Program Time in AIMS

Multi-state programming includes any program that involves Arkansas Extension Service and any other state's Extension Service at any level. Examples include multi-state Extension committees, national 4-H trips, and multi-state fairs and festivals.

There are two places you can go to in AIMS to report your multi-state time. You can stay on the My Reporting page and report your hours to the respective objective (below). This works best if you do not have client contacts to report.

Reporting of time involved in multi-state programming in AIMS is done differently than other time. Unlike any other time entered into AIMS, all multi-state time needs to be reported in “Program Planning & Delivery Time” field, **as well as** in the “Multi State Extension Activity” field. This means your time is reported twice in AIMS. In either location, you take the same steps to enter in your multi-state time.

-If you are reporting **ONLY** multi-state time (which includes any time dedicated to the actual activity and the prep time before and/or after the event), enter in the number of hours in **BOTH** the “Program Planning & Delivery Time” and the “Multi-State Extension Activity” fields.

-If you are reporting both multi-state time and other (non multi-state) time to the objective, enter in the total combined time into the “Program Planning & Delivery Time” field, then **ONLY** the multi-state time in the “Multi State Extension Activity” field.

For example, if you worked 120 hours in a month in a particular objective area and 40 of those hours were multi-state, then you will report 120 hours under “Program Planning & Delivery Time,” then 40 hours under “Multi-state extension activity.”

-Once you have hours entered in the “Multi State Extension Activity” field, you will see a drop-down menu appear directly below it. Select the activity from the drop down menu that matches what Multi-State activity the hours supported. If your activity is not listed in the drop down, select “Other” and provide the name of the activity in the text box below the drop down.

-Make sure to click “Submit” at the bottom of the page to save the time you just entered (and any contact data you entered, if necessary).

NOTE: If you need to report to multiple activities, you will need to enter them in separately to allow for proper tracking of each activity.
