County 76 Master Gardeners support UA master gardener programs through the Janet B. Carson County Scholarship. Scholarships are funded through County 76 silent auction proceeds as well as private donations and may be awarded in amounts of up to \$750.00. Proposals must include an educational component that affects the county's service area. An active master gardener with the approval of his/her local master gardener program may apply with only one application accepted per county program per year. Preference will be given to innovative projects that affect the start-up of a new project or a new component added to an existing project.

Applications must be postmarked or emailed by January 15, 2021. Notification of approval will be sent by February 15, 2021. Receipts related to this project must be submitted to County 76 Janet B. Carson County Scholarship Committee; ATTN: Master Gardener Office, 2301 S. University Avenue, Little Rock, Arkansas 72204 for payment. All funds for the approved scholarship must be used by December 15, 2021.
