Ornamental Grasses by Scientific Name

Scientific Name	Common Name	Comments
<u><i>Carex sp.</i></u> 	Ornamental Sedge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Usually a low (12"), clump forming grass • Many species and cultivars (mainly for variegated leaves) • Full sun
<u><i>Cortaderia selloana</i></u> 	Pampas Grass	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large (10'), clump forming grass • Full sun • Dramatic plumes • Invasive in western U.S.
<u><i>Festuca ovina</i></u> <u>'Glauca'</u> 	Blue Fescue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Small (8 to 10"), clump forming grass • Full sun • Selections for improved blue color; 'Elijah Blue', 'Boulder Blue' • May also be listed as <i>Festuca cinerea</i>
<u><i>Imperata cylindrica</i></u> <u>'Red Baron'</u> 	Japanese Bloodgrass	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Size: 15 to 18" • Leaves red in full sun • Spreads by rhizomes to form patch
<u><i>Miscanthus sinensis</i></u> 	Maiden Grass	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medium sized (4 to 5'), clump forming grass • Cultivars: 'Gracillimus', 'Zebrinus', 'Strictus'

<p><i>Pennisetum alopecuroides</i></p> 	<p>Fountaingrass</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Low (18 to 24"), clump forming grass • Cultivars: 'Hameln', 'Moudry'
